Launched with the participation of 2922 students, this program aims to promote environmental awareness and responsibility among students by involving them directly in tree planting and nurturing activities.




Project Overview

Objectives:

- **Distribution of Saplings:**

Each student received one tree sapling free of cost.

The saplings were distributed with instructions on proper planting techniques and care.

- **Home Planting:**

Students were required to plant the saplings at their homes.

While planting, they had to display their name, roll number, class, and college name on a white paper attached to their shirt for identification.

- **Video Documentation:**

Students recorded a 2-minute video of the entire planting process, ensuring their participation was clearly visible.

The video was then uploaded to a designated Facebook page provided by the college.

- **Follow-Up Video:**

After three months, students uploaded another video on the same Facebook page, showcasing the growth and care of the sapling.


The second video also included the student's details as before.

- **Surprise Inspections:**

Representatives from the college conducted surprise visits to students' homes to verify the growth and health of the saplings.

This ensured accountability and encouraged students to take the project seriously.




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Assessment Criteria:

- The project was part of the Environmental Science (ENVS) Internal Assessment, carrying 25 marks.
- Proper adherence to the project guidelines was crucial, as failure to comply would impact the students' ENVS project grades.

Benefits of the Programme:


- **Environmental Education:** The programme provided a hands-on learning experience in environmental conservation.
